National Theatre Conference

Person of the Year, Polly Carl, has named playwright Mary Kathryn Nagel as the 2015 recipient of the Paul Green Award that honors young theatre professionals. Polly Carl, director of HowlRound



and ArtsEmerson at Emerson College in Boston, was previously, for two years, at Steppenwolf Theatre and 11 years at the Playwrights' Center in Minneapolis.



Mary Kathryn Nagle, born in Oklahoma and a citizen of the Cherokee Nation, is an alum of the Public Theater's Emerging Writers Group where she wrote Manahatta.

Manahatta was performed

as staged readings for the United Nations
Permanent Forum on Indigenous People and as a
part of Public Theater's NEW WORK NOW
series. Public Theater workshopped it at
PUBLIC STUDIO and it was named a top-three
Finalist for the 2014 William Saroyan Prize for
Playwriting, and named the Runner Up for the
2015 Jane Chambers Playwriting Award.

American Indian Artists produced Nagle's play *Miss Lead* as an equity showcase in 2014 at 59e59 Theaters (New York). Nagle was a member of the Civilians' Research and Development Group in 2013-2014, where she wrote *Fairly Traceable*. Her other plays include: *In My Father's Eyes*, *Diamonds...are a Boy's Best Friend, Sliver of a Full Moon* and *My Father's Bones* (with Suzan Shown Harjo). *Sliver of a Full Moon* has played at Yale Law School, the United Nations Permanent World Conference on Indigenous People, and at Public Theater's JOE's PUB.


Nagle currently lives in Washington D.C. where she practices law and writes plays.
